1. Prayer & Welcome

2. The School Day

Our classroom door will generally open around 8:30am. Children are expected to unpack their own bags and set up their work station for the day. Siren will ring at 8:45am.

If you need to remove your child from the class during the day, you will need to sign him/her out at the office. This will need to be done before you come to collect your child. The same procedure applies if you arrive late in the mornings.

3. Curriculum

Religious Education is our main learning area with the Australian Curriculum fully implemented across English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences (Geography – Semester 1 & History – Semester 2), Health & Physical Education and The Arts. The outcomes, learning activities and common assessments will be reflected in both Year 1 classes to ensure that all Year 1s are taught and levelled according to Year 1 national curriculum outcomes.

Excursions are a big part of our learning journey, whether it's local or in Perth. Our aim is to have 1 excursion each term which will reflect what is being taught in class.

4. MAJEC

The MAJEC Program is our Christian Service Program. The children will be given a MAJEC card that they need to complete. There is also a class MAJEC program that we will be doing in class.

5. Assessment

Test books will be sent home two times each term. Once you have looked through the tests and work samples please sign the cover page and send it back to school.

6. Homework

The children have a Homework Folder which they are expected to take home each night and return the following day. Any notes to go home will be placed in this folder. The Communication/Homework Book is to be used to communicate with me and vice versa and should be checked every night for any additional information or timetable changes.

Please date and initial any notes specific to your child so I know they have been received. If your child is absent please send in a written note or email the front office.

Reading Homework

- Children are expected to read their home reading book each night. Their reading log should be signed by an adult. At times, if your child didn't read the book confidently and with fluency, they may need an extra night with the same book to practice.
- Children will be selected to read to myself, or a helper every day and I will be testing them once a month depending on their development.

Sight Words

- A sight words booklet will be sent home for practice for those that need it and they will be tested regularly. If your child can read the sight words, encourage them to practice writing them and putting them into sentences. This will assist with their writing throughout the year.

7. Parent Handbook

All current policies are printed in the handbook please refer to them as necessary.

8. Uniform

Children are expected to wear the correct St Joseph's uniform including footwear and a note will be placed in the communication book to address any uniform issues. Please ensure all items are clearly marked with your child's name.

The school has a very strict NO HAT, NO PLAY policy therefore hats will remain in your child's bag whilst at school.

Children should not wear jewellery or nail polish to school. They will be asked to remove jewellery and asked to remove nail polish.

Assemblies

Assemblies are on Fridays at 8:45am in the St Marcellin Performing Arts Centre. The aim is fortnightly assemblies and parents are always welcome. If your child is receiving a merit certificate I will contact you to let you know via the communication book. Please check the school calendar for more information.

9. Birthdays

I am happy for treats to be sent in for children's birthdays. If you are unsure as to 'what's best' please check with myself prior. We currently have 28 children in the class.

10. Behaviour Management

Positive verbal feedback and encouragement will be strongly used in the classroom. Rewards such as stickers, stamps, free time or fun class activities will also be used. Warnings are given when a rule is broken, along with why and how the rule was broken. Should the behaviour continue, further consequences will be to work away from the group, movement to a buddy class and/or time out from recess or lunch (max 5 min). Severe behaviour issues will be dealt with by Mrs Rebecca Clarke, Head of Primary.
