### 2. The School Day

Our classroom door will open at 8:30am (only bus children are allowed to enter the classroom before the teacher opens the door). Children are expected to unpack their own bags and bring their folder and water bottle into the classroom. They can then choose an activity to engage in with their classmates or parents. The siren will ring at **8:45am**, parents are asked to leave the classroom at this time. As the year progresses we will ask parents to drop their children at the door to aid in the development of their independence as they transition to Year 1.

On Wednesday Mrs Oliver will teach the class from 11.00am-3.05pm. She will cover the Science and Humanities and Social Sciences Learning Areas.

If you need to **collect** your child from the class during the day, please sign him/her out at the office. This will need to be done before you come to collect your child from the classroom. The same procedure applies if you arrive late in the mornings.

The school day concludes at 3.05pm. Please ensure you arrive on time to collect your child as children can become anxious and upset if they are left waiting for their parents. If you arrive

before 3.05pm please do not enter the corridor outside the classroom as this is very distracting for the children as they complete their end of day tasks.

### **3. Curriculum**

Religious Education is our main Learning Area with the Western Australian Curriculum fully implemented across English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, Health & Physical Education and The Arts. The outcomes, learning activities and common assessments will be reflected in both Pre-Primary classes to ensure that all Pre-Primary students are taught and levelled according to Foundation Year national curriculum outcomes. Please consult our learning intentions board just inside the classroom for up-to-date information on our current curriculum focus areas in the class.

News Day is every Thursday. News is a great way to develop oral language skills with a big focus on speaking and listening. We will be sending home a news bag every Monday afternoon. These news bags have a topic of focus for your child e.g. a photo of your family. Please encourage your child to sit down and fill out the sheet found in the news bags.

Our learning program incorporates a combination of play based child-led learning and explicit direct instruction. Each lesson will begin with an explicit mat session followed by play based learning centres.

### **4. MAJEC**

The MAJEC Program is our Christian Service Program. The children will be given a MAJEC card that they need to complete. There is also a class MAJEC program that we will be doing in class. Please encourage your child to engage in frequent service acts to complete their cards. These need to be returned to school once completed.

### **5. Assessment**

Learning Journals will be sent home once each term. Once you have looked through the common assessments and work samples please sign the cover page and send it back to school.

### **6. Communication**

The children have a Reading Folder which they are expected to take home each night and return the following day. Any notes to go home will be placed in this folder. The Communication Book is to be used to communicate with myself and vice versa and should be checked every night for any

additional information or timetable changes. Please date and initial any notes so I know they have been received. If your child is absent, please send in a written note or email the front office. There is also a link on our school website for absentees.

## **7. Home Reading**

Children will begin home reading when they have mastered a number of pre-reading skills. Reading books will be sent home at different stages of the year as children develop the necessary skills to succeed with reading. These pre-reading skills are:

- Knowing all 26 alphabet sounds
- Able to blend onset and rime (eg. C+at = cat)
- Able to blend three sounds (eg. C+a+t = cat)

Children will also be expected to practise basic sight words in conjunction with their reading books. These words are the most common words found when reading. It is important for reading fluency that these words are learnt from sight with a quick recall, not sounded out.

Children are expected to read their home reading book each night. Their reading log should be signed by an adult. The children will read to myself, Mrs Collins or a parent helper every day and I will be testing them once a month depending on their development.

All current policies are printed in the handbook please refer to them as necessary.

## **9. Uniform**

Children are expected to wear the correct St Joseph's Sports uniform, including footwear. Please ensure all items are clearly marked with your child's name.

The school has a very strict NO HAT, NO PLAY policy. Your child must have the correct navy blue wide brimmed school hat. These can be purchased from the uniform shop or school office for \$10.

Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied up with navy blue or black hair ties. Accessories can be purchased from the uniform shop. Nail polish must not be worn to school.

Please ensure your child has a spare change of clothes in their school bags in case of an accident.

## **10. Assemblies**

Assemblies are on Fridays at 8:45am in the undercover area until we move into our new classrooms. These assemblies are usually held fortnightly and parents are always welcome. If your child is receiving a merit certificate I will contact you to let you know either by phone, text message or a note in the communication book. Please check the school calendar for more information.

## **11. Fruit Time**

At our morning break, students are expected to consume fruit/vegetables and a small snack. Please ensure your child has fruit/vegetables in their lunchbox every day. If your child does not have fruit/vegetables, they will receive fruit from the canteen and you will be required to pay

50c the following day to cover the cost of this. We encourage healthy snacks such as yoghurt, muesli bars and crackers.

### **12. Birthdays**

I am happy for treats to be sent in for children's birthdays. Cupcakes or individual treats are easiest to handle in the classroom. We currently have 30 children in the class. This year we have a child in Pre-Primary who is allergic to peanuts, milk and egg products so please be mindful of this.

### **13. Behaviour Management**

Positive verbal feedback and encouragement will be strongly used in the classroom. We are currently working with a 'Bucket Filler' positive behaviour management system. Children displaying positive behaviours receive pom poms in their buckets. When their buckets are full they receive a small reward. Rewards such as stickers, stamps or fun class activities will also be used.

Severe behaviour issues will be dealt with by Mrs Rebecca Clarke, Head of Primary.

### **14. Parent Help**

I am always happy to have helpers in the classroom. A roster has been placed outside the classroom door. We will be starting parent helpers a little later this term as we have swimming lessons in weeks 5 and 6.

Please sign in at the office before coming to the classroom and bring your Parent Participation Levy Form for me to sign. We ask that all parent helpers leave when the children go out to lunch at 12.30pm (or earlier as your schedule requires).
